Road Commission director receives fellowship from American Public Works Association

Flint, Michigan. ---

Genesee County Road Commission Manger-Director John Daly has been notified by the International Affairs Committee of the American Public Works Association (APWA) that he is a recipient of a 2010 Jennings Randolph Fellowship. The award is based in part on work Dr. Daly did on public works projects in Russia, Ireland and Israel prior to his tenure at the Road Commission. His background in transportation, public works and infrastructure sustainability were key to his selection.

Like all recipients of the award, Dr. Daly is required to participate in the partner's National Conference for its full duration plus a minimum of one-week of study either prior to or following the conference. Recipients are also expected to address the partner's National Conference on the subject of their study (partners include the public works associations of New Zealand, Mexico, Australia, Slovakia and the Czech Republic); prepare an article for the APWA Reporter on the study of the partner's public works project(s) within one year of return; make a presentation at the next available APWA Congress on the study tour explaining how the study tour contributed to the participant's professional development and what impact management policies and innovations learned in the host country will have on the participant's local government; complete a 100-300

word abstract of the proposed presentation to the APWA Congress; and bear all costs beyond the Fellowship allowance.

Dr. Daly will document his experiences in Mexico in an article he will write for a future issue of the APWA Reporter magazine. He will be recognized at the APWA's 2010 Congress in Boston in August, 2010 and he will participate in an educational session about his study project at the APWA's Congress in Denver in 2011.

The Jennings Randolph International Fellowship Program was established at the Eisenhower World Affairs Institute 1987 and is administered by the American Public Works Association. The mission of the Eisenhower Institute is to advance Former President Dwight D. Eisenhower's intellectual and leadership legacies in foreign and domestic policy through: a rigorous pursuit of facts; the encouragement of reasoned and respectful debate; and the quest for outcomes that serve the American people while promoting justice and international peace.
