Local Road Agreement for Roadway Rehabilitation to the Pinnacle Shores Subdivision; Pinnacle Shores, Pinnacle Shores #2 and Pinnacle Shores #3, Fenton Charter Township – In a memorandum dated April 17, 2023, staff requested the Board approve the local road agreement with Fenton Charter Township for the Pinnacle Shores Subdivision in Fenton Charter Township. Resolution of Support for Road Commission participation in the proposed Perry Road Phase 2 Trail – In a memorandum dated April 05, 2023, staff requested the Board approve the Resolution of Support for the Genesee County Road Commission's role as lead agency for the proposed Perry Road Phase 2 Trail project. (Copy filed with official minutes.)

Commissioner Gehringer stated that the language is not clear who pays for the maintenance of this project once it is completed. Managing Director Peivandi states that it does say the Genesee County Parks & Recreation Commission will be maintaining the facility but agrees the language should have been clearer.

The term was for 20 years, expiring on September 10, 2022, On September 07, 2022 the Board and LSC executed a Lease Addendum (1st Addendum) on a month to month basis while both parties worked to negotiate the long-term lease agreement.

- Annual rent for the lease agreement is \$4,400 per year, due and payable on or before the 11<sup>th</sup> day of May during the term of the Lease Agreement.

Chairperson Elkins commented that some of these increases are astronomical and asked if we have alternative sources we can use. Director Love-Brezzell answered that in some instances we do have alternative resources. However, for some suppliers such as C&S Motors we do not. Commissioner Smith asked if these increases develop over the fiscal year, Director Love-Brezzell said it is throughout the year but for some of the increases it is because we are buying additional supplies at the higher prices.

Commissioner Gehringer asked if there is any way to negotiate these prices down. Staff answered that when we have a price increase, we meet with the vendors and explain how hard it is to buy at these higher prices. We try and build relationships with our vendors over time.

Then at that point, we will bring the contract back to the whole board and make modifications if they are needed.

The Township Committee will consist of him and Commissioner Massey. Chairperson Elkins explained that he and Commissioner Massey would be looking into issues behind the scenes such as quotes, invoices, and performance of work on the job sites explaining that the townships are our

customers. We would like them to help us with the issues we are dealing with.

Chairperson Elkins added that this Board is making an impact and will get a lot accomplished in the next few years. We are here as a Board to discuss benefits, pensions and policy in order to make a positive impact on the Road Commission.
