As we begin another construction season, the Genesee County Road Commission is eager to take on more than 157 miles of improvements. That includes over seven miles of federal aid projects including three bridges and traffic signal updates at eight locations, over 20 miles of resurfacing on local roads, over 78 miles of chip seal and fog seal, over 30 miles of limestone resurfacing, and several other projects. All of this adds up to more than \$47.5 million. You'll read about some of those improvements in this newsletter.

This month, GCRC will also be participating in National Work Zone Awareness Week to encourage drivers to slow down and pay close attention in work zones. The recent death of a Van Buren County Road Commission worker emphasizes the importance of driving safely where workers are present. This year's NWZAW theme is "You play a role in work zone safety. Work with us." We implore Genesee County residents to work alongside our employees to make work zones safer for all. Thank you for your patience and cooperation as the Genesee County Road Commission works to make our county roads better for years to come.

Why does GCRC build roundabouts?

- **Safety** Roundabouts improve safety by lowering speeds. They also reduce the number of conflict points, resulting in fewer serious or fatal crashes.
- **Operations** Roundabouts keep traffic moving, minimizing the amount of time vehicles are stopped. This also means less pollution.
- **Maintenance** Roundabouts require less maintenance because there are no traffic signals which require expensive equipment.


